Report on Meetings

In the last Newsletter we mentioned **Neighbourhood Plans**, and at the June committee meeting, we welcomed Mike Shields, Chair of the Altrincham Neighbourhood Business Plan Working Group. Mike had prepared notes regarding the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan and talked us through the various stages of the procedure. These included the reasons for doing a Plan, public consultation and commitment as well as the financial and legal obligations - a lot of work. We decided not to proceed, as plans usually stem from some problem which affects an area.

Civic Day this year was a bit quieter than last year but we still signed up two new members. We are pondering on a different venue, and activities/ displays for next year - has anyone got any ideas?



What's Going On

I came back from holiday to find all sorts going on: Holy Cross Church house is in process of demolition; work is being done on one of the older semis near the Stonemasons; and the road works at Park Road / Manchester Road are finished at last - or are they?

Planning Applications - in the last couple of months we have looked at several applications. The Library - there has been much discussion, with letters to the local paper, but we have not commented on the planning application. There is the additional one for a portacabin behind the old li-

brary / Riddings Community Centre on Park Road to serve as a temporary library (88511). There is still no news about the future of the Community Centre after the new library is built.

<u>Dobbinets Lane</u> (actually Hale but we use the road) - at The Dog Tub kennels and cattery - The plan is for 13 houses on land currently used as a paddock backing onto Fairywell Brook, with landscaping and an access road where the current buildings. (88639) It would use the current entrance on Dobbinetts Lane and we are concerned about traffic - it's near that nasty narrow bend, and encroachment on Green Belt.

<u>Nat West, Stockport Road</u>-There's a plan to change to residential part of the building with the front door next to the bank.

<u>Shell Petrol Station</u> near the Hare & Hounds - plan to replace the current building along with new car parking layout.

<u>New Bridge</u> over canal near Broadheath - there's a plan for a new pedestrian and cycle bridge, over the canal to the east of Viaduct Road, with a new towpath on the south side of the canal from there to Wharf Road.

There have been some applications for 'historic' buildings in Timperley and nearby:

<u>Forest School</u>, Moss Lane applied for an extension for a single story hall between the existing buildings (88342) this would involve digging up the farmyard belonging to the original farmhouse dating from the 1750's.

And in Hale - Lathom Hall Farm on Clay Lane - this is set back from the road near Timperley Brook. It's possible there may be remains of earlier buildings on the site - may need an archaeological assessment. Roaring Gate Lane, Hale - there's an application for a new dwelling house on the field next to Roaring Gate Farm. Chapel House was built next to the farmhouse quite a few years ago, and there is an annexe that is residential. But this would be a new build - again there may be remains of previous buildings in that field.
